REVerberations

Easter is the most meaningful event in the Christian faith. Without it, there would be no Christian faith at all.

It is also a time that evokes questions about what really happened back then. How critical is it that we believe the stories of physical resurrection? Which of the varying accounts should we believe? What is the larger meaning of the telling of those stories? What should Easter mean for us now? And what does it really mean to you in your life or for me in mine?

We have this week to contemplate all of that again, Holy Week when we will mark various important moments in the stories about Jesus' passion and what became of him and his followers after that.

This past Sunday, Seekers explored Marcus Borg's notion of the "pre-Easter Jesus" and the "post-Easter Christ." The former refers to the man named Jesus of Nazareth and the latter refers to what the Church created after his death. If you have not read Borg, I would recommend him for your reading list. You might start with Meeting Jesus Again for the First Time.

I came away from that Seekers conversation, as I often do, with a deep appreciation for the opportunity we have here to ask questions with each other, and to seek answers we don't yet have and never may. To me, that is the essence of living faith – wondering, and all the while doing the good we can do in the world.

May your Holy Week be in every way blessed as we move together toward new life, not necessarily knowing, but longing still.
